#### WHAT IS A WEIGHTED CASELOAD?

- A weighted caseload considers the barriers clients face towards achieving a specific goal
- Goals are diverse, in our sector it frequently looks like sustainable employment, finding housing, maintaining housing, addictions recovery
- Weighted caseloads seek to afford clients the time they need to move forward
- Unlike traditional models, caseworkers will not have a fixed number of clients, rather they have a fixed amount of time that they can work with clients

### **HOW DID WE GET HERE?**

- Higher needs' clients were underserved
- Wide range in time clients require from caseworker
- Issues around equity and burnout for caseworkers
- Fresh eyes on old problems

### **OUR LEARNING PROCESS**

Are some barriers more of an issue depending on the program goal? e.g. criminal records for maintaining housing vs obtaining sustainable employment

Surveyed 17 employment support workers from various organizations in Calgary

Compiled results to gain an average 'weight' of each identified barrier

Multiplied the barrier weights by the client's score within that barrier

Created a user friendly 'tool' for everyday use and to maximize the benefits of collecting data

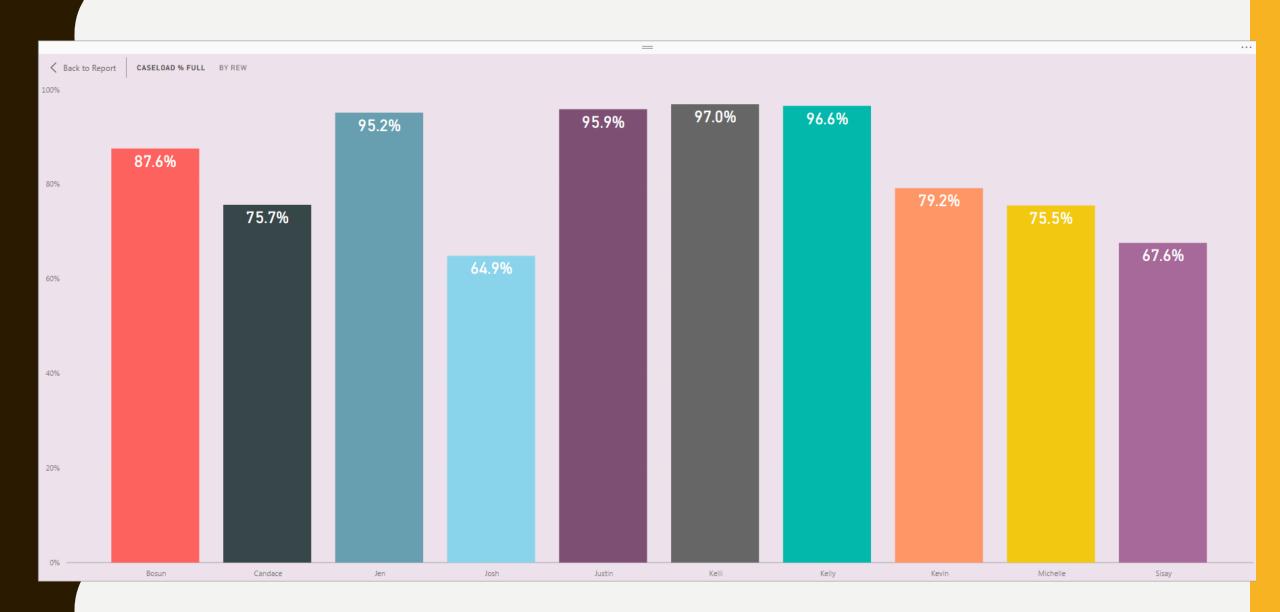


Created an intake process

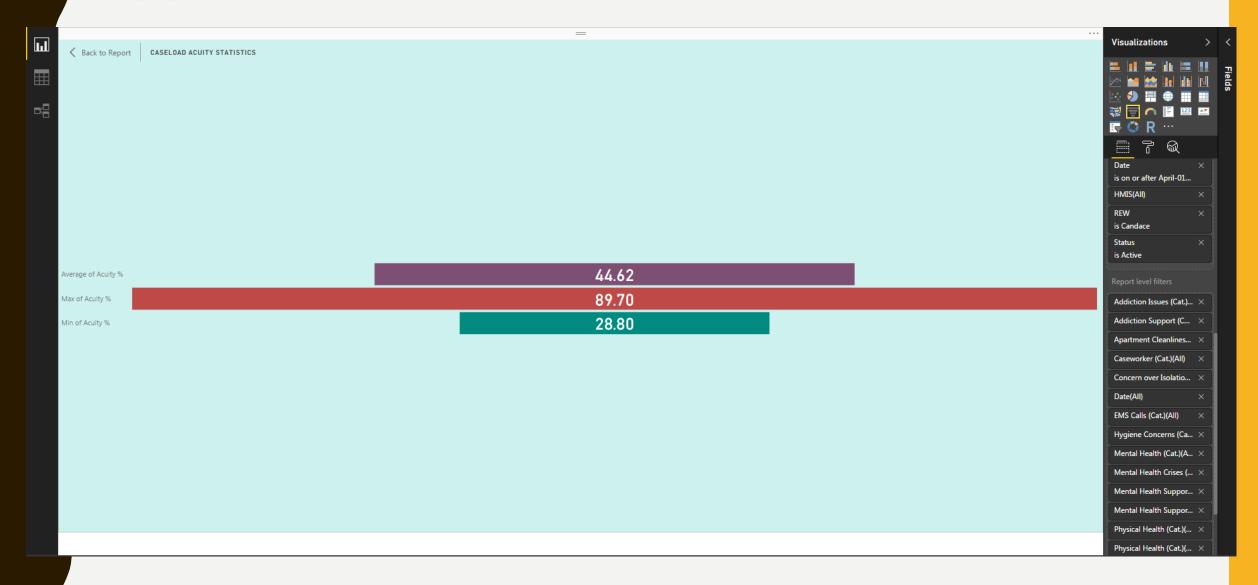
Calculated caseworkers' available client time

Converted client acuity to time

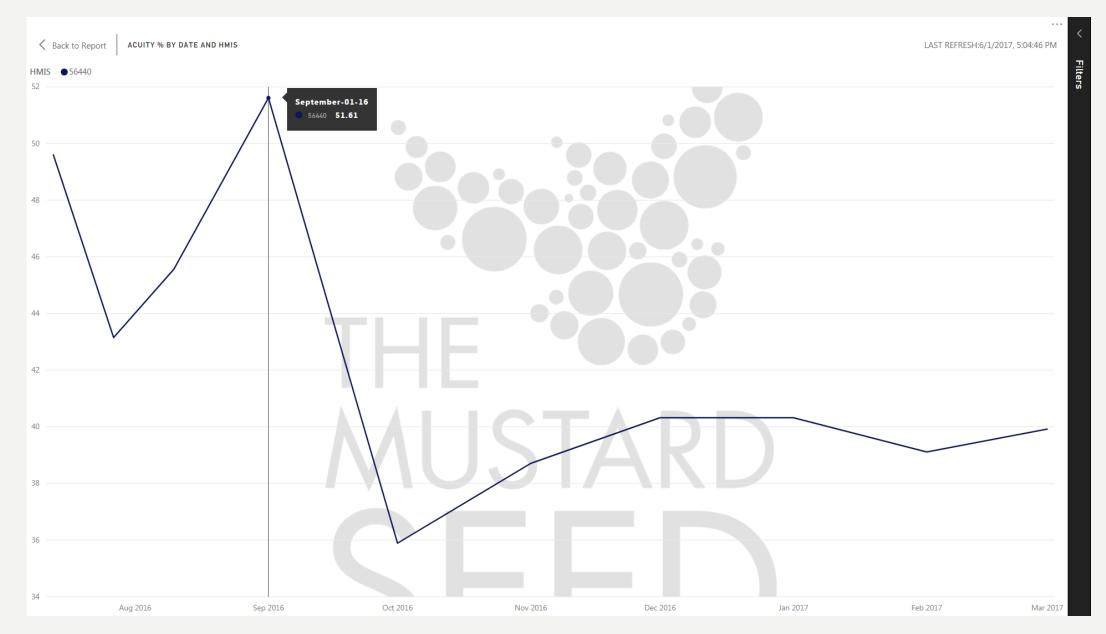

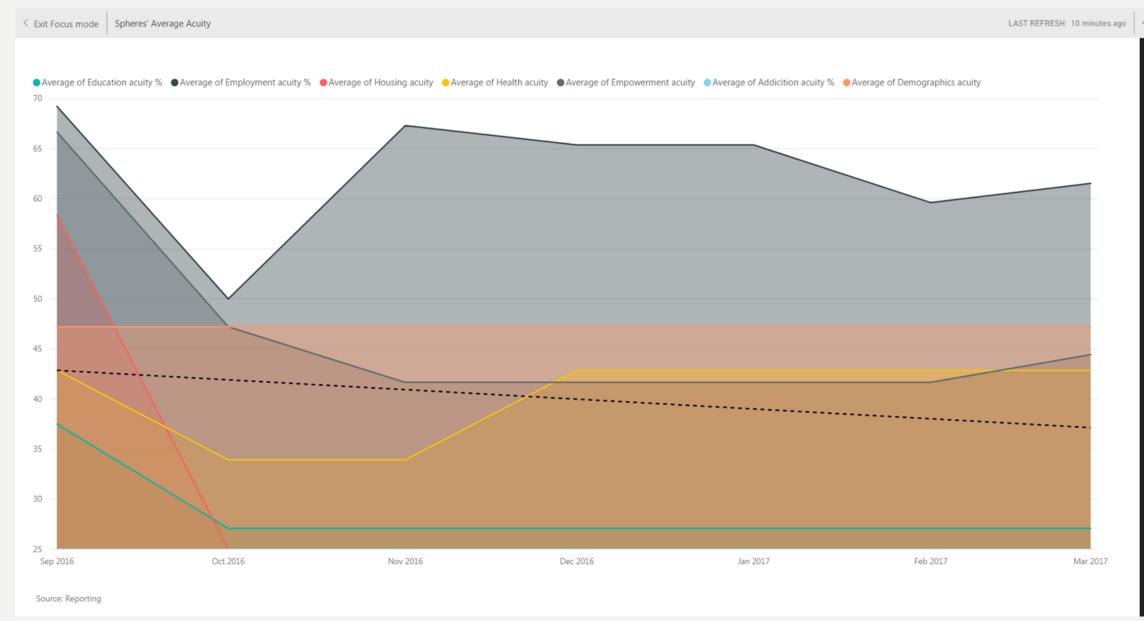

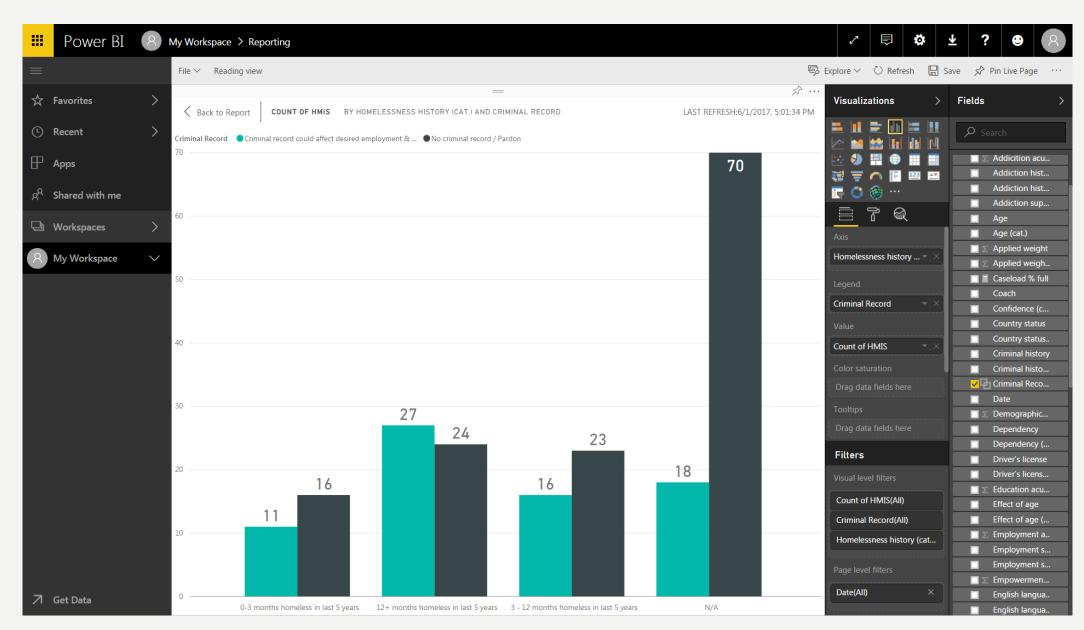


# **Application: Client Management**

#### PRELIMINARY RESULTS

- Prior success rate: 15.3% clients graduated the program \*Employment Program July 2015-December 2015 (18/118)
- Use of the tool: 19.2% clients graduated the program \* Employment Program July 2016-December 2016 (15/78)
- The overall rate of increase: 20.3%

## **COMPARING MODELS**

#### **Traditional Caseload Models**

- Assumes that all clients require the same amount of time
- Fixed number of clients on caseload
- Managers/Supervisors assign according to perceived space
- Caseworkers frequently report stress and inability to adequately serve high acuity clients
- Often takes a quantity over quality approach to achieve objectives

#### **Weighted Caseloads**

- Attempts to afford clients time with caseworker according to barriers
- Number of clients on caseload varies according to acuity
- Managers/Supervisors assign according to caseworker strengths and caseload capacity
- Ability to track acuity
- Can be used to better understand staff performance
- Provides a quality over quantity approach to achieving objectives
- Client success rate is the focus
